## Dog Fouling

The Parish Council has made efforts over the last year to increase the number of dog bins and provide free poo bags. However, we are still getting complaints about dog fouling and more cases of owners using the bags but then leaving them on the floor or in hedgerows for others to pick up and dispose of. Please pick up your dog waste and put it in the bins provided.

The Rushcliffe Borough Dog Fouling Order carries an on the spot fine of £50, or a fine of up to £1,000 on prosecution applies if you allow your dog to foul in a public place and you fail to clean it up straight away.
